Professional Background

Tadas helps public- and private-sector clients secure and defend state and federal environmental permits and local land use approvals for complex or controversial development projects throughout the state, including infrastructure, energy, and marine terminal projects. Tadas provides strategic counsel at the permitting stage, working with the client, consultants, and regulators on permit applications and environmental review conducted by local and state permitting authorities, including the Energy Facilities Site Evaluation Council. When a permit is appealed, Tadas appears on behalf of clients at all levels of appeal, including state and federal courts and in administrative adjudicative proceedings, including appearances before the Shoreline Hearings Board, the Pollution Control Hearings Board, the Growth Management Hearings Board and local hearings examiners. Recently, Tadas has represented a wide range of energy companies by providing strategic counsel for the permitting and environmental review of renewable energy projects that will help meet the state's aggressive carbon reduction targets. Additionally, Tadas helps those companies advocate for local and state legislation and implementing regulations related to those greenhouse gas reduction efforts, including the regulatory programs implementing Washington's new Clean Fuels Program and the Climate Commitment Act.

Tadas also represents cities, counties and port districts in drafting, adopting and defending regulations required by the Growth Management Act (GMA), the Shoreline Management Act (SMA), and the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA).

Representative Experience

- Represents Puget Sound Energy, the largest energy utility in the Pacific Northwest, in the appeal of the permit approvals and environmental review for a first-of-its-kind LNG liquefaction/storage facility in the Port of Tacoma, Washington. The project will process up to 250,000 gallons of LNG per day for storage in an 8 million gallon tank that will be used for "peak shaving" (regasification and injection into the local natural gas distribution system on peak demand days) and for use as a maritime and transportation fuel, including LNG for Totem Ocean Trailer Express's ORCA-class vessels that deliver up to 35% of all goods, commodities and supplies to the state of Alaska. In an appeal before the PCHB that lasted almost a year and a half and included a two week evidentiary hearing, the firm successfully defended the permit and EIS, including the adequacy of the environmental review of the greenhouse gas emissions as analyzed in a lifecycle emissions analysis.
- Represented the City of Seattle defending the City's environmental review of several land use proposals in appeals before the Hearing Examiner and the Growth Management Hearings Board. Tadas worked with the City Attorney's office to defend the Environmental Impact Statements (EISs) for the City's Mandatory Housing Affordability (MHA) policy and its changes to regulations governing accessory dwelling units, both of which seek to address the complicated issue of housing affordability in Seattle. Tadas also worked with the City Attorney's office to defend the Seattle Department of Transportation's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Burke Gilman "Missing Link" project, one of the final steps in a nearly thirty-year legal dispute over the City's plan to complete the existing gap in the famous multi-use trail.
