PHMSA awards One Call Grants to states. PHMSA requests comments on several gas report forms and an NPMS information collection, and holds Public Awareness workshop Select updates from the states and Canada.

PHMSA Awards \$1 Million in One Call Grants

On June 14, the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) announced over \$1 million in grants to 30 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico to support state 811 "Call Before You Dig" programs. More information is here.¹

PHMSA Activities

Proposed Revisions to Report Forms. Today, PHMSA published a notice and request for comments on proposed revisions to the incident and annual report forms and the associated instructions for gas transmission, gathering and distribution pipelines and LNG facilities. PHMSA also proposed changes to the mechanical fitting failure report form for gas distribution operators. The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) authorization for the current forms expires on February 28, 2014, and PHMSA intends to make numerous changes to the forms and resubmit them to OMB for approval. Comments are due on August 26. The notice is here,² and the docket is here.³

NPMS Information Collection. On June 14, PHMSA sought comment on its request for renewal of an existing OMB authorized information collection concerning the National Pipeline Mapping System (NPMS). PHMSA

has proposed no changes to the current process for collecting NPMS data from pipeline operators. Comments are due August 13. The Notice is <u>here</u>.⁴

Public Awareness Workshop. On June 19-20, PHMSA held a Public Awareness Workshop in Richardson, Texas. PHMSA and state regulators shared observations from recent inspections and participants explored ways to improve communications and information sharing between pipelines and emergency responders, local officials, and the public. PHMSA plans to organize a Public Awareness working group that will continue to review inspection findings, identify gaps in public awareness requirements and explore how to improve public awareness. The group plans to release its findings later this year. More information, including presentations and a video of the workshop, is here.⁵

Select Activities from the States and Canada

Illinois

Illinois Gas Pipeline Safety Act. SB 1458, a bill to amend the Illinois Gas Pipeline Safety Act to add specific provisions describing the content and procedures for notices of probable violation, civil penalties, hearings and other matters, has passed both houses and was sent to Illinois Governor Pat Quinn on June 24. SB 1458 is <u>here</u>.⁸

Missouri

Rate Recovery of Pipeline Replacement Costs. Missouri Sen. Brad Lager (R-District 12) introduced legislation that would permit gas corporations to increase from 10% to 13% the amount of revenues recoverable under an Infrastructure System Replacement Surcharge (ISRS). SB 240 also would increase the length of time an ISRS may be collected from three to five years. No change from last update. SB 240 is <u>here</u>.⁹

Texas

Texas Railroad Commission Jurisdiction. On June 14, Texas Governor Rick Perry signed HB 2982, a bill that provides the Railroad Commission of Texas (RRC) with expanded authority to regulate certain presently exempt intrastate pipeline facilities. The law authorizes regulation of certain intrastate rural hazardous liquid gathering lines and also allows regulation of currently exempt, Class 1 intrastate gas gathering pipelines. Any expansion of gas or hazardous liquid gathering pipeline regulation by the RRC must be based on risk or as necessary to maintain the "maximum degree of federal delegation" allowed under the federal Pipeline Safety Act. The law is effective September 1, 2013. HB 2982 is here.¹⁰

Canada

NEB Issues Regulations on Monetary Penalties. Canada's National Energy Board (NEB) has issued Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMP) Regulations outlining the maximum daily penalties for violations of

laws and regulations that promote safety and environmental protection in the energy industry, including for pipelines. The AMP Regulations set a maximum daily penalty of \$25,000 per violation for individuals and \$100,000 per violation for companies. The AMP Regulations provide that each day a violation continues is considered a separate violation, and there is no maximum total penalty. The regulations are effective July 3. The AMP Regulations are here,¹¹ and more information is here.¹²
