NTSB Chair Stepping Down

Deborah A.P. Hersman, chairman of the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) <u>announced</u>¹ on March 11 that she will be stepping down from the position April 25, 2014 to become the President and CEO of the National Safety Council. The current vice chairman, Christopher Hart, will assume the role of Acting Chairman.

Other NTSB Developments

NTSB Releases Report on Sissonville Accident. The NTSB released its <u>Accident Report</u>² on the December 2012 natural gas pipeline incident near Sissonville, West Virginia. The NTSB concluded that the probable cause of the pipeline rupture was external corrosion of the pipe wall because of deteriorated coating and ineffective cathodic protection and failure to detect the corrosion. The NTSB recommended that the Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety Administration (PHMSA) revise its integrity management regulations to add principal arterial roadways to the list of identified sites that establish a high consequence area (HCA). The NTSB also recommended that the operator provide pipeline controllers with guidance on responding to alerts; modify its SCADA system to improve the ability of operators to identify potential system malfunctions; and ensure that integrity-related information gathered on pipelines located in HCAs is considered in assessing the risk and integrity of non-HCA pipelines.

NTSB Investigates Pipeline Failure in New York City. The NTSB continues to investigate a pipeline explosion that occurred on March 12 in the Manhattan neighborhood of East Harlem. The investigatory team issued <u>preliminary findings</u>³ on March 18.

PHMSA Activities

PHMSA Extends TAG Application Deadline to March 31. PHMSA has extended until March 31, 2014, the deadline for submitting applications for a <u>Technical Assistance Grant</u>.⁴ The grants are designed to support the pipeline safety-related activities of local communities and non-profit entities.
